**LAEF Leads the Charge to Send Robotics Team to Championship!** 

(Los Alamitos, CA) – Did you know that the brand-new Los Alamitos High School Robotics Team

won the Orange County FIRST Robotics Competition on April 2, which was the first competition

they ever entered? The win qualifies them for the 2016 FIRST Robotics Championship from April

27-30 in St. Louis! Incredible news, but it created a problem for the team: how, in such a short

time, would they be able to raise the funds to get there?

LAEF (Los Alamitos Education Foundation) heard about the situation and happily stepped

in to help. LAEF's Board of Directors approved a donation of \$10,000 to fund the team's trip to

the championship tournament, which was supported by the Seal Beach Lions Club at \$1000, Run

Seal Beach at \$1000, and Alamitos Eye Care at \$500.

In addition, the Robotics Team was in desperate need of tools. Phillips Steel stepped up

in a huge way by providing the team with nearly \$1000 in brand new tools! Ganahl Lumber

invited the team on a shopping trip to acquire additional tools and supplies, free of charge!

"I am so excited for the Robotics Team's trip to the championship tournament! This is an

extremely talented group of students who are establishing a team that will endure at LAHS for

many years to come," says LAEF Executive Director Carrie Logue. "I am thrilled with the LAEF

Board's decision to provide funds, and with the amazing local businesses and organizations that heeded the call to support the Robotics Team!"

The LAHS Robotics team, officially named Team 6220: Build It Grilffins Boeing Robotics, is coached by Mark Lengsfeld, owner of Build It Workspace. Boeing got the team off the ground by funding the robot and the county competition entrance fee. Los Alamitos Unified School District supplied the \$5000 fee to enter the World championship tournament. The team consists of students William Dang, Jacob Flynn, Grayson Galisky, Matt Guggiana, Evan Hartman, Nick Jones, Noel Limb, Andrew Stumpf, Wyatt Snyder and LAHS staff members Martin Valenzuela and Dan Bennett who serve as team mentors.
