Job Title: After-School Instructor

Status: Part-time, Seasonal

Position Summary:

The After-School Instructor will create curriculum based on their specialty/area of interest to provide enrichment during the after-school hours. The After-School Instructor will be responsible for creating a safe, engaging, and educational environment for students who are attending national distinguished schools. This role involves planning and implementing age-appropriate activities, providing academic support, and fostering academic and social development.

Suggested class subjects (but are not limited to): fine art, science, technology, engineering, language arts, sports/athletics, martial arts, chess, dance, cheer, drama, singing, acting, music, cooking, chess, etc.

The ideal candidate will understand how to provide rigor and extended learning experiences within the context of a progressive learning environment. The strongest candidates will have experience working with faculty members and students in a diverse learning context that features an interdisciplinary and project-based curriculum.

Qualifications:

- High School Diploma
- Experience working with elementary school students
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- Ability to work with students in small or large groups
- Engaging and dynamic presence in front of a class
- Effective classroom management skills
- Ability to self-reflect on teaching practices and be responsive to feedback

- Bachelor's degree in related subject
- Successful classroom teaching experience
- Multiple-subject teaching credential or a single-subject credential

- Provides class objectives and assesses student progress toward achieving objectives
- Guides students to work collaboratively and to think logically and creatively

- Builds effective relationships with district teachers, office staff, parents and students through regular communication.
- Collaborates with LAEF Program Manager to provide the best instructional environment possible

Compensation: Pay from \$600 - \$800 per class section: 1 hour and 15 minutes per week for 12 sessions/weeks. Pay from \$460 - \$610 per class section: 55 minutes (TK-K classes) per week for 12 sessions/weeks. Work periods will reflect the district's calendar within LAEF's fall and spring sessions.

*Opportunities to teach multiple classes per week.
